

Janoš for vice president



Czechs tired of the uniformity of the local coverage of the U.S. presidential race might find pleasure in searching out video clips of Jesse Ventura. He's an eccentric former professional wrestler who became governor of Minnesota and now, as an independent, says there should be a box on the presidential ballot for "None of the Above."
