Inclusive and deleterious



Commenting on Barack Obama's visit to Prague, the [New York Times](#) wrote that Obama has emulated Václav Havel's "inclusive brand of politics." Such is the stuff myths are made of! Obama, at this point, is the [most divisive](#) U.S. president in 40 years, and VH the great polarizer has plenty more to teach BHO in this respect.
