Vanity in motion



A country in crisis needs moral leaders, but the Czech Republic lost one of its few moral authorities yesterday. By agreeing to become chairman of TOP 09, Karel Schwarzenberg gave cover to Miroslav Kalousek and his many dubious deeds.
