Should Czechs fear China? 투

Russian journalist <u>Yulia Latynina</u> said recently that Russians fear America very "loudly," because everyone knows there's no risk that it will conquer them. The Kremlin's fear of China is much quieter, she said, but it derives from a terrifying expectation that China wants to overrun the country, esp. in the Far East. Czechs, for their part, fear Russians far more emphatically than they fear the Chinese. The biggest recent news about China came when a Czech journalist spoke unkindly of its ambassador. Yet as Czechs worry openly about becoming overdependent on Russia for energy, Moscow is signing deals to sell more and more of that energy to China.
