The 'elite'

A record number of Czechs are out of work, but the Czech and Slovak elite made an ostentatious display of attending a snow-polo tournament over the weekend at the invitation of one of the Five Families, J&T. In keeping with the tone, Patrik Tkáč of J&T told <u>Euro</u> that politicians and businesspeople have been getting together for thousands of years and will continue to do so. Corruption has been around forever, he said, while democracy is only 250 years old or so.
