Czechs like to be in the thick of things. Many of those who were against the U.S. radar were furious when Obama killed the idea, because they could no longer complain that it was being shoved down their throats. MP Lubomír Zaorálek of ČSSD now feels left out of the EU debate about rescuing Greece. It's dividing Europe, he told Respekt, yet we don't even know the cabinet's opinion on it.
