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Natland's bright future



Tomorrow's transportation strike has diverted attention from many things, one of which is the rise in the standing of Natland Group. As is often the case with mysterious Czech companies, the facts are thin, but two things seem likely. Natland appears to be a vehicle for cleaning up and cooling down money that is too hot even for shady international bankers to handle. If this business model proves successful, there will be plenty of other hidden cash piles for Natland to tap.



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
