Kalousek's Promopro



News from [Právo](#) today that Miroslav Kalousek is under criminal investigation for suspicion of taking a bribe from Marek Dospiva of Penta will shake things up politically. Remember what [Kalousek](#) said on Feb. 10? "The case of a state contract for Promopro is so serious that I consider it out of the question for anyone responsible for this contract to have government decision-making authority until the matter is investigated." He didn't succeed in forcing Defense Minister Alexandr Vondra out of office. Not yet, at least. (See today's [Aktuálně.cz](#).) Now it's Kalousek's turn to apply the same morality to himself. But in actuality, Kalousek's case is more like Martin Roman's than Vondra's. Kalousek and Roman have been untouchable for years and are now being brought down to size, even if they never go to prison. It's tempting to think, at least for a moment, that this means things are changing in the Czech Republic.
