Class war and economic gloom

All the main Democratic candidates are running against Donald Trump on the same agenda, according to <u>columnist David Brooks of the New York Times</u>. Their argument, he said, is that capitalism is fundamentally broken and that the economy is bad. This was the same anti-Trump message that Hollywood sent on Sun. by picking "Parasite" and "Joker" as two of the big Oscar winners. Democrats should instead run on values, he said. If there is a lesson in this for Czech opposition parties (and esp. ČSSD), it's that a class war, like a hot war, must be timed properly, otherwise it achieves the <u>opposite of the desired result</u>.
