Criminal liability for the lockdown



When former Communist Party Secretary-General Miloš Jakeš died on July 10, he was facing charges for abuse of position for not doing anything to prevent the use of weapons against those trying to cross the border illegally. Because of inaction by Jakeš and two other top officials, Lubomír Štrougal and Vratislav Vajnar, nine people reportedly died on the border, and at least seven more were injured. Today's political leaders should keep this in mind.
