Czech military instructors in Ukraine

It's incomprehensible that a retired general of Pres. Petr Pavel's stature could say (at 2:50pm) that it's no more dangerous in terms of a possible Russian reaction to train Ukrainian soldiers in Ukraine than to train them in the CR. The CR, according to PM Petr Fiala, is <u>one of</u> the safest countries in the world, whereas Ukraine is a war zone.
