STAN, Dosimeter, PDZ ... and BIS



Just as ANO was [about to call](#) for a [special session of Parliament](#) about the [PDZ credit union](#), Dir. Michal Koudelka of the BIS counterintelligence agency conveniently launched a [media campaign](#) to portray Prague as a hub for Russian influence of European politicians. One of Koudelka's favorite media outlets, [Deník N](#), then identified Petr Bystron (Bystroň) of AfD of Germany as one of the suspects. This indirectly shines a bad light on SPD, Tricolor and ANO on grounds of [guilt by association](#). BIS has a [wide agenda](#), from guarding against religious terrorism to fighting illegal employment, and tracking Russian spies is certainly within its purview. But aren't the facts and suspicions laid out by [Jaroslav Kmenta](#) in [Reportér magazine](#) about Ivan Netuka, Miloš Růžička and other people at the [center of Czech power](#) a greater potential security threat than a minor opposition politician in Germany? By law, BIS reports to the government of Petr Fiala, but that doesn't mean its duty is to protect it.
