Planning for demobility



Hand in hand with the Green Deal's unstated objective of the deindustrialization of Europe is the demobility of Europe, for lack of a better term. Nearly all of the EU's green-transformation measures, from emissions allowances to the combustion-engine phase-out, will make it more expensive to get from one place to another. Less travel, after all, means less carbon. Just recently Vice PM Karel Havlíček swore allegiance to the [EU's climate targets](#), yet the Czech finance ministry also hired a new CEO for Prague Airport, Radomír Lašák, who is supposed to help the [Babiš government](#) address [one of its priorities](#), that of the further development of Prague Airport. For outgoing CEO Jiří Pos, this meant plowing ahead with expansion plans, including a new parallel runway. For Lašák, a former management consultant, it should mean mapping all of the EU's demobility measures and estimating their mid- and long-term impact. He might find that Prague Airport won't need that controversial new runway after all.
